# Materials Policy

At Duramen Builds, we provide all materials for our projects as part of our full-service remodeling and construction process. This allows us to guarantee quality, accuracy, and accountability every step of the way.

### Why We Provide Materials

### Vendor Partnerships

We've built strong relationships with trusted vendors, purchasing in bulk at contractor discounts. This allows us to apply a standard markup that supports our business while still giving you access to high-quality materials at competitive prices.

### Accountability

By managing the ordering process, we take full responsibility if materials arrive damaged, if there's a miscalculation, or if adjustments are needed. In most cases, we order 10–20% additional material (depending on the product) to account for waste, miscuts, or damaged pieces.

#### We also:

- Order materials in advance and verify inventory before they're needed.
- Plan ahead to avoid shortages or delays.
- Keep projects moving smoothly so work isn't held up by missing items.

## Reliable Pricing

Our quotes are numbers you can rely on. The only time your project cost changes is if there's a formal change order that alters the scope of work.

It's also important to note:

- It's normal to have leftover materials at the end of a project. We order extra as insurance to avoid costly delays.
- Returns are not credited back—those additional materials are built into the quoted price to ensure we have enough to complete the job without interruptions.

## **Exceptions**

Occasionally, we make exceptions for unique or specialty materials that can't be purchased through standard suppliers. In these cases, we will:

- Take inventory of what's on site.
- Verify quantities and calculate what additional material may be required.

Build in a small surplus to prevent delays from miscuts or damage.

Please note: because homeowner-provided materials cannot be marked up, our labor pricing may be adjusted in these cases.

### What We Don't Do

To be transparent about our process:

- We do not install homeowner-supplied materials in most cases.
- We do not take on projects that are already underway or managed by the homeowner.
- We do not act as a subcontractor for partial scopes of work.

Our model is full-service general contracting—we put together all the parts and pieces, coordinating vendors, in-house carpenters, and subcontractors to bring your project to life seamlessly.
